#### **Hand Drumming**







Hand drumming is an excellent practice for building coordination, focus and memory. As a group social activity, hand drumming can improve mood and reduce feelings of stress and anxiety. In this group we warm up by learning and practicing rhythms and expanding upon them. We can then use our creative energy to make up rhythms and play along with some songs.

No experience necessary. You will need your own drum, such as a djembe or conga which is played while seated in a chair. You can play on a bucket bottom, but it should be round and without any rim or edge to hurt your hands. 280-300mm diameter is a good size.

The group is now meeting in the .HC Community House in Centreway Rd behind the bowling club. on the second Monday of the month from 10:30 am to 12 noon.
