Guest Speaker: David Schnauer



David Schnauer is a North Shore resident who ran a large law firm for many years but is now turning his hand to economics, writing about the hard decisions he believes New Zealand should make to lift its economic performance over the next 75 years.

His latest book, *Uncomfortable Economics*, is out soon and David spoke recently to the Takapuna U3A about his 75-year plan for the country. A proud New Zealander, David has spent much of his life frustrated by our economic underperformance. In his view, the challenge is not identifying what needs to change. It is finding the political and societal courage to do it. One of David's key ideas is to make retirement savings compulsory.

This will be a challenging talk as you can see from the title of his book, but U3A is always up for a challenge. We are leaving ample time for questions at the end.

We will also have 3 or 4 minispeakers from our groups.
